Dear Parents,

OPENING TO RECEPTION, YEAR 1 AND YEAR 6

We are getting ready to receive your child(ren) next week. We are hoping that the routine for the day will be as follows:

- Your child's 'bubble' will be based in either the Reception or Year 6 class. Parking for both the Reception/Y1 and Y6 classes will be at the very bottom car park on the bend and walk up the path to the junior playground for Y6, continue around the outside of the building in order to drop Reception/Y1 in the outside area. By Wednesday or Thursday we will be able to let you know the day your child will start.
- Reception/Y1 drop off time is 9.25am, collection is 3pm. Y6 drop off is 9.40am collection is 3.15pm. Please exercise social distancing rules at all times and you may need to be vigilant and wait to access areas where this is not possible (e.g. steps up to Reception class). Please be on time, as you will need to have left the premises before the next group of parents arrive.
- Uniform/bags and coats your child will not need to be in uniform but they do need to come in a clean set of clothes each day they are in. Bags, water bottles and pencil cases are not allowed apart from a pack lunch box from home, if not having a school lunch. Coat/waterproof and sun hats are ok and will be put on the back of your child's chair, you may also want to send in sun cream which can stay in school. Water, pens, pencils etc. needed in school will be provided at the desk your child will be using.
- Fruit you may send a piece of fruit in with your child to have at morning break. Please provide this in a small sandwich bag which can go in the bin. Currently, the free fruit for infants is still not running so we can't supply fruit in school.
- Lunch as mentioned above you can send in a packed lunch or you can order a school meal at the normal price for juniors and of course infants are free.
- Break times and lunch time lunch will be served in the classroom and all breaks will be taken in a designated area for your child's group.

Your child will stay in their 'bubble' for the remainder of the school year. This is to ensure the risk of infection spread is kept as low as possible, the safety and wellbeing of our pupils/school community is paramount to all the planning/changes we are taking.

We are grateful for your support and understanding at this challenging time and will continue to update you as our plans continue to adapt and change according to Government, Trust and Local Authority guidance.
