Key Knowledge

- Advent is a season when we think about God's great gift of love: Jesus. This is called the Incarnation.
- The word Advent means coming or arrival.
- We prepare for Jesus coming at Christmas and remember that Jesus will come again.
- **Isaiah** was a prophet from the Old Testament who was waiting for the coming of the Messiah.
- The 3rd Sunday of Advent is called 'Gaudete Sunday', which means 'joy'. We are halfway through Advent.
- The Wise Men also came to visit Jesus. They were not Jewish. *This shows that God's love is for everyone.*
- Gold: a symbol of a king. Frankincense: a symbol of being God. Myrrh: a symbol he would die.

Prior Knowledge and Skills

- Advent is when we prepare for the coming of God into our world at Christmas.
- Isaiah wrote about God's promise to send a son.
- The Advent Wreath and the Jesse Tree (family tree of Jesus).
- The **Annunciation** is the visit of the Angel Gabriel to Mary to tell her about God's gift.
- The Visitation: Mary's words praising God when she visited Elizabeth are remembered in a prayer called 'The Magnificat'.
- Mary and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem.
- God gave us his only Son because He loved us and wanted us to know more about His love.
- The shepherds (the poorest and least important) were chosen first to visit Jesus. This shows that Jesus came to serve the poor.
- The Wise Men also came to visit Jesus. They were not Jewish. This shows that God's love is for everyone.
