We received this information at the same time as you and, although we have obviously been thinking about what may happen in September, we will now be looking at this guidance in detail with support from the Trust. Whilst we appreciate that you and your child will have lots of questions, please be assured that we will release more information as soon as we can.

We can tell you we have started working on a, "Recovery Curriculum" which focuses on 5 main levers of: relationships; community; curriculum; metacognition and space to be a learner again. This is a systematic, relationships-based approach to reigniting the flame of learning in each of our pupils. Advice for this has been written with thanks to Clive Davies who has over 40 years of experience in primary education, has been a head teacher, an Ofsted inspector, advisor, trainer and consultant and has written over 60 educational publications. This work will be tailored to the needs of the children at St Elizabeth's and written by staff now and over the summer.
