

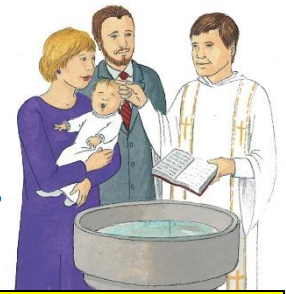

Key Vocabulary and Definitions

belong	To be part of a group.
Baptism	A welcome to God's family.
candle	A Baptismal Candle is lit for the baby by the Godparents.
priest	Our priest is Father Michael.
white garment	A white blanket or shawl.
godparents	An adult who promises to help the baby grow up to know and love Jesus.
font	The container in a church that holds Holy Water.
invitation	To ask someone to do something.
sacrament	Church celebrations that are personal meeting points with God. They are sacred signs.
Sign of the Cross	The sign we make to remind us of what we believe. God gave us his only Son, Jesus, and fills our hearts with the Holy Spirit because he loves us all.
