- 'The promises made at Baptism are a call to a new way of life. At baptism, people are welcomed into the Church.'
 - We consider the above reason (along with other reasons) why people choose to be or have their child baptised.
- We learn what happens during Baptism: The promises made; the baptism with water; the anointing; the giving of the white garment and candle. We also consider what each action symbolises.
- We will revisit the story of Jesus baptism and consider if any actions link to the actions used in today's Baptism celebrations.
