This Harvest time, we invite pupils and staff to make contributions to local food banks as part of our ongoing efforts to support those in need in our local communities. We are excited to support **Hope for Belper Food and Community Hub** again this year and continue to strengthen this link with our community.

We are requesting that donations are brought in the week beginning **Monday 27th September**. Pupils should bring their donations into their own classrooms to form class Harvest displays. All donations should be brought into school by **Friday 1st October** as this is when we will be holding our Harvest Celebrations.

This year, we are requesting the following types of donations:

- 'Meal in a Tin' (The Foodbank are always in need of tins that contain a meal and do not require meat or vegetables added e.g. tinned curries, chilli con carne, meatballs in sauce etc)
- Tinned sweetcorn and carrots
- Tinned potatoes and packet mash
- Long-life puddings (Steam puddings, tinned fruit, rice pudding, custard etc)
- UHT Milk
- Toilet Rolls
- Deodorant
- Shampoo
- Toothbrushes

Donations of other items will, of course, be gratefully accepted.

All items should be in an 'as new' condition, be in date and have safety/security seals intact.
