Scarlet fever and impetigo

As you are aware from recent letters, we have been informed that a small number of children who attend **St Elizabeth's CVA** have been diagnosed with suspected / confirmed Strep A infections which can include illnesses such as scarlet fever, sore throats and impetigo.

Although scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, it should be treated with antibiotics to minimise the risk of complications and reduce the spread to others.

The symptoms of scarlet fever include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. This is followed by a fine red rash which typically first appears on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to





other parts of the body. On more darkly-pigmented skin, the scarlet rash may be harder to spot, but it should feel like 'sandpaper'. The face can be flushed red but pale around the mouth.

If you think you, or your child, has a Strep A infection (which includes scarlet fever, throat infections and impetigo):

- see your GP or contact NHS 111 as soon as possible
- make sure that you/your child takes the full course of any antibiotics prescribed by the doctor
- stay at home, away from nursery, school or work for at least 24 hours after starting the antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection
- If you or your child has a high fever, severe muscle aches, pain in one area of the body and unexplained vomiting or diarrhoea seek medical help immediately.

We will continue with enhanced cleaning in school, raise awareness of good respiratory hygiene (catch it, bin it, kill it so that coughing and sneezing is done into a tissue/hand covering nose/mouth), regular handwashing and use of sanitiser. We have CO₂ monitors in each classroom and will be opening windows to allow fresh air into classrooms on a regular basis.

If your child has been diagnosed by a doctor with a confirmed case of a Strep A infection please call the school office, we are in regular communication with Public Health England and the local East Midlands Health Protection Team and will continue to follow their advice.

Recommended time off of school for Strep A – once on antibiotics - is 24 hours for scarlet fever and 48 hours for impetigo (which can often be mistaken for hand foot and mouth), this will obviously be longer if your child is on antibiotics and not well enough to return.

Supporting the SEA

Our upcoming Christmas Fayre is in the afternoon of Friday 16th December. It will start at 2pm and children will be allowed to leave with parents **after** 3pm. The school buses will still run at 3.30pm. It would be wonderful to see as many parents/carers and family members as possible at the Christmas Fayre.

Anti bullying work with EqualiTeach – Invite to online parent meeting

We are undertaking a project on anti-bullying with an agency called EqualiTeach in order to ensure we meet requirements of the Equalities Act, guidance from the Catholic Education Service (making it clear that bullying of any type will not be tolerated) and also to respect protected characteristics. Identity based bullying is bullying that targets an aspect/aspects of a person's identity. Our current policies in place encompass a wide range of the definitions of bullying. Bullying happens rarely at St Elizabeth's, suggesting that the policies and procedures are working well. However, we are always looking to refine and improve and by working with EqualiTeach we want to continue to give the message that we are all made in the image and likeness of God and as such the dignity of the human person needs to remain at the forefront of everything we do.

The content of our RSHE scheme Ten:Ten Life to the Full and our PSHE programme cover all necessary curriculum aspects and for this reason we will not be making any adaptations to our curriculum in light of our work with EqualiTeach. However, we will be drawing upon some aspects of their expertise on some matters of policy e.g. disability awareness in relation to our accessibility policy, uniform policy and anti-bullying policy. In the case of any change to policy, ratification from our Governors would be required and where necessary we would seek to consult with parents.

EqualiTeach have met with our Governors and are now offering a presentation to any parents who would be interested in knowing more about anti-bullying. All parents are welcome to join one or our virtual meetings with EqualiTeach at either 4.30pm or 5pm on Monday 23rd January to hear the presentation and ask any questions afterwards.

I would like to take this opportunity to assure all parents that our partnership with EqualiTeach is conducted on the understanding that all initiatives and work will be carried out in line with our Catholic (Christian) values and beliefs, so that Christ and the teachings of the Catholic Church remain at the centre of all we do.
