What makes 'community'?



Key Knowledge

- At the beginning of his **ministry**, Jesus chose certain people to follow him and share his work (**apostles**).
- We belong to the **Parish** of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour (Belper) and St Margaret Clitherow (Duffield).
- Christians today are called to be with Jesus and share in his mission.
- Parishioners are called to various **ministries** to build up the parish **community**: **extraordinary ministers** of Holy Communion, ministers to the sick, readers, hospital visitors, SVP etc.
- Within the **funeral** Mass: Holy water and the Easter Candle are used as symbols of Baptism and new life in Jesus; A cross or Bible is placed on the coffin as a symbol of Christian life; incense symbolises prayers rising to God.
- Sacraments are an encounter with Christ at special times in a Catholic's life.
- God has prepared a place for us in heaven. We believe in resurrection and life after death.



Key Vocabulary and Definitions

community	A group of people that share something in common
deanery	Several neighbouring parishes joined together in one group.
Extraordinary Ministers	A lay person who assists with the distribution of Holy Communion.
Funeral Rites	Ceremony and actions held for a person who has died
laity	Lay people – those who are not ordained
ministries	The special roles, which we are called by God to do, to serve the community.
Parish	The Christian community in a local area.
pastoral area	Some parishes are joined together to form a pastoral area/deanery.
service	To do things for other people and/or for God.

Prior Knowledge and Skills

- Year 1: People who help at Mass on Sunday (the greeters, priest, deacon, altar servers, readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion).
- Year 2: We go out after Mass to share the Good News of Jesus with others.
- Confirmation Topic: Through the **Sacraments**, the **Holy Spirit** helps us to grow closer to God in love and guide us in our lives.
