

#### Welcome Back

Welcome back! We hope you have all had a delightful Christmas and New Year and we are looking forward to having the children back in school for our Lent 1 term.

#### R.E.

We have started our fourth topic of the term, 'Mission', in which we will be thinking about our local church, diocese and community. We will investigate what it means to have a mission in life, referring back to Jesus' mission and how he sought to achieve it, referring to ecumenism and Christian unity. Following this, we will begin our fifth topic, Memorial Sacrifice, in which we will learn all about the significance of the link between the Eucharist and the Last Supper. We will investigate transubstantiation and consecration and how we remember Jesus' ultimate sacrifice today. These Knowledge organisers can be accessed on the class webpage.

On the afternoon of Tuesday February 6<sup>th</sup>, we have CAFOD presenting a workshop on Catholic Social Teaching (the idea that God built his kingdom on love, peace and justice). We also have a class retreat with Chaplain Joe in the morning on this date.

Excitingly, on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> February (Shrove Tuesday) Mardi Gras day is returning to St. Elizabeth's! The children are invited to wear purple, gold and green and may bring in whistles, maracas etc. for our parade. Our bright gold P.E. kit is a great costume if you are stuck for ideas! The children will spend the day learning about the history and significance of Mardi Gras... and of course there are pancakes for lunch!

Year 5 are also leading our Ash Wednesday mass on Wednesday February 14<sup>th</sup> at 9.30 with Father Colin Patey (our visiting priest). All are welcome to join!

# English

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Writing: Following our balanced discussions last term, this half term we will be writing our own myths! Linking nicely with our current Ancient Greeks history topic, the children will create their own myth, based upon our model text of Perseus and Medusa. To build action and suspense within this topic, the children will be encouraged to integrate writer's tricks such as onomatopoeia, repetition, dramatic fronted adverbials, direct speech and short sentences. We will also be reading other myths to help build up our story bank, such as the Legend of Troy, Jupiter and the Bee and Pandora's Box.

Reading: The children's reading in Year 5 is coming along splendidly, and we are really noticing the impact of home reading! As a reminder, the children should continue to utilize their reading bookmarks at home, on which they are to write down any words that they are unfamiliar with or have struggled to pronounce. Your child is expected to bring their home reading book into school once a week, on a set day (which the children are aware of). This is so that teachers and teaching assistants can listen to them read and track their progress. If your child fails to bring their book two weeks in a row, you will receive a letter making you aware of this.

This half term, our class read is Funky Chickens by Benjamin Zephaniah. Each day we read one of Zephaniah's fantastically funky poems, alongside which we read 'The Story and Life of Benjamin Zephaniah', to learn all about his life and works. Did you know he hails from a town in Jamaica called St. Elizabeth's?

In our Talk for Reading sessions this half term, we will be covering extracts, lyrics and videos from texts such as The Black Amulet, Song for a Whale, Foreign Lands and FArTHER.

#### Maths

In Maths this half term, we are now moving forward with Multiplication and Division. This includes short multiplication (multiplying larger numbers by a one-digit number), long multiplication (multiplying larger numbers by two-digit numbers) and bus stop division (dividing larger numbers by a one-digit number). Practice on TimesTablesRockstars will help with this greatly! Once completed, we will them move onto our first fractions unit of the year. We will begin with a recap of equivalent fractions, moving onto converting mixed and improper fractions before ending with comparing and order fractions and using fractions to divide.

#### P.E.

The children will have two P.E. lessons each week; Wednesday and Fridays. This term, they are doing dance on Wednesdays and football on Fridays. Children are to come to school in their active uniform on these days. Outdoor kit should include plain black tracksuit bottoms, yellow polo shirt, yellow sweatshirt and outdoor trainers. Please ensure all items are fully labelled! For convenience, I politely ask that long hair be tied back, and earrings removed on P.E. days. Whilst we advise against it, if your child's earrings are new and unable to be taken out, they must be taped over with surgical tape, brought in from home.
