## Key Knowledge

- In the Gospels, we read about Jesus' **mission**. He came to share the Good News that God loves us and that living in God's way brings love, justice and peace.
- Jesus called 12 apostles to share his mission.
- Apostle (one who is sent out); Disciple (follower).
- Parish families form larger Christian communities called dioceses.
- Each diocese has a bishop (appointed by the Pope).
- The **bishop's** role is to preach the Gospel and help everyone be grow in faith through his witness.
- The **bishop** oversees his **diocese** following the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. He wears a **mitre** and carries a **crozier** (symbol of caring for his people like a flock).
- There are different groups of Christians but Jesus wanted his followers to live in **unity** with him and each other.
- Through Baptism, all Christians are called to share Jesus' mission, but carry it out in different ways.
- All Christians are journeying towards God and towards unity. This movement towards Christian unity is called ecumenism.

#### Prior Knowledge and Skills

- Y2: We go out after Mass to share the Good News of Jesus with others
  Y4: Through the Sacraments (e.g. Confirmation), the Holy Spirit helps us to grow closer to God in love and guide us in our lives. Symbols of the Bishop's authority and role. God calls people in different ways.
- Y3: Baptism is a Sacrament. Through Baptism Christians are called and set apart to do the work of Jesus.
- Y2 & 3: Eucharist or Holy Communion is a Sacrament. The parish celebrate together and take what they receive into the community.
- Gospel means Good News.
- At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus chose certain people to follow him and share his work (apostles).
- We belong to the Parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour (Belper) and St Margaret Clitherow (Duffield).
- Christians today are called to be with Jesus and share in his mission.
  Parishioners are called to various ministries to build up the parish community: extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, ministers to the sick, readers, hospital visitors, SVP etc.
