

<p>The Nativity of Mary: The school year will begin with the children learning about different phenomenal women throughout history to celebrate the birthday of Mary. Each class will learn about a 'phenomenal woman' linked to their Catholic Social Teaching Principle and class Franciscan Value.</p> <p>Class Values: During the Advent Term, each class will focus on their class value and present their understanding of this to the whole-school in their Celebration of the Word. Each class will take part in a retreat to learn more about their class Franciscan value.</p> <p>St Francis of Assisi: In recognition of our Franciscan Heritage, we celebrate the Feast of St Francis of Assisi by making cards and making stewardship pledges. Classes decide on an area of the school to care for.</p> <p>Our Lady of the Rosary: We welcome Bishop Patrick into school to celebrate this feast with us and to pray a decade of the rosary. This will be live streamed across the Diocese. During October, pupils will learn more about the rosary and create a school set of rosary beads from log slices. Diocesan schools are invited to share their work on the rosary with us too.</p> <p>Harvest Festival: We will hold our annual Harvest festival and gather donations to support Hope for Belper foodbank. In response to parent feedback, all year groups will lead different songs, readings and poems.</p>	<p>The Empty Chair: As we enter November, a month dedicated by the Church to remembering those who have died, we introduce the 'Empty Chair'. The empty chair symbolises those who are no longer with us. It is the seat they would have once taken and a symbol of the space they still occupy in our hearts and minds. Families are invited to fill in luggage tags with the names of deceased family and friends. The tags are tied to the chair and the chair is present for all of our times of prayer and liturgy.</p> <p>St Elizabeth of Hungary: During this half term we celebrate the feast of St Elizabeth of Hungary. We remember the story of the miracle of the roses and her words of service to the poor.</p> <p>The Jesse Tree: During Advent, seasonality will be shown by gathering in darkness with the growing light of the Advent Wreath. The community will gather in a horseshoe around the Jesse Tree focus area. Whole-school Celebrations of the Word are daily as different staff members and groups of pupils retell the story of Jesus' ancestors.</p>	<p>A journey through Ordinary Time: During this period of Ordinary Time, we hear in the Gospels, the stories of Jesus' ministry.</p> <p>Pilgrims of Hope: We now enter our jubilee year (beginning 24th December 2024), which is themed 'Pilgrims of Hope'. There will be opportunities for the whole school community to experience the joy of taking action together, seeing their role as pilgrims of hope in building a better world.</p> <p>Class Retreats: This term, the class retreats will focus on the principles of Catholic Social Teaching and linking these to the jubilee year to further develop children's understanding.</p>	<p>Ash Wednesday: We mark the first day of Lent with our Ash Wednesday Mass, to which the parish and whole community are invited.</p> <p>Crown of Thorns: During the first week of Lent, classes reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus through a 'Crown of Thorns' Celebration of the Word. During this time of prayer, children think about what sacrifices (Lenten promises) they can make for Jesus and remove a thorn from his crown.</p> <p>Reconciliation: During Lent, Fr Neil will offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation to pupils and staff in school.</p> <p>Lenten Campaign: During Lent, we focus on the needs of others. We support CAFOD through our Big Lent Walk to raise money for communities who need our help.</p>	<p>Eastertide: We will begin the Pentecost term with an Eastertide Mass. This will help the children to see, feel and understand the difference in atmosphere between Lent and Easter.</p> <p>Mary, Mother of God: During the month of May, we honour Mary, the mother of God. We will focus on saying and singing the Hail Mary. We will also hold a Marian Procession, to which the parish and wider community are invited. Donations of flowers will be used in the celebration and then distributed in the local community.</p>	<p>Ascension: As Ascension falls in the school holiday, we begin this half term with a celebration of Ascension, with classes reflecting on themes of loss, death, new life and leadership.</p> <p>Corpus Christi: To mark this feast, classes will develop their understanding of the Eucharist and the Body of Christ. Classes will take part in a collaborative project to create a whole school crucifix.</p> <p>Saints Peter and Paul: As this Solemnity falls on a Sunday, the chaplaincy team will lead the whole school in a Celebration of the Word on this theme during the following week.</p>
<p>Class Retreats and Pilgrimage: Throughout the year, classes will take part in retreats on dates closely associated with a saint linked to their class name/place of pilgrimage.</p>
